2. CATEGORIES AND AGES

Based on WSE INLINE HOCKEY EURO Competition rules, article 11.4

U18 Men: Minimum age of fourteen (14) years of age and not yet eighteen (18) in the year of the competition (concerns players that will be fourteen (14), fifteen (15), sixteen (16) and seventeen (17) years old in the year of the competition). **U18 Men are born, in 2022, in 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2008.**

U16 Men: Minimum age of twelve (12) years of age and not yet sixteen (16) in the year of the competition (concerns players that will be twelve (12), thirteen (13), fourteen (14) and fifteen (15) years old in the year of the competition). **U16 Men are born, in 2022, in 2007, 2008, 2009 and 2010.**

Senior Women's Age: Minimum age of Fifteen (15) years of age, computed according to World Skate rules. As of January 1st, of the year of the Championship. **Senior Women are born, in 2022, in 2007 and above**

Junior Women: Minimum age of fourteen (14) years of age and not yet nineteen (19) in the year of the competition (concerns players that will be fourteen (14), fifteen (15), sixteen (16), seventeen (17) and nineteen (19) years old in the year of the competition) **Junior Women are born, in 2022, from 2004 to 2008**

3.1.2. COMPETITION FORMAT

The competition will consist in a round robin with 3 groups of 3 teams (Groups A / B / C)

The teams ranked on the 1st and the 2nd position of their groups are qualified to quarter final phase consisting in 2 groups of 3 teams (Groups D and E). The teams ranked 3rd will join a ranking group (Group R)

- Group D : 1st A / 2nd B / 2nd C
- Group E : 2nd A / 1st B / 1st C
- Group R : 3rd of groups A / B / C

Teams ranked 1st and 2nd of D & E will play a semi final

Winners of the semi-final will play the final, losers of the semi-final will play bronze medal game.

Teams ranked 3rd of Group D and E and 1st of Group R will play a ranking Group phase of 3 teams to determine the 7th to 5th positions.

Teams ranked 2nd and 3rd of Group R will play a 8th and 9th places game.

7. REGISTRATION RULES

- a) In order to participate to a WSE INLINE HOCKEY EURO Competition, national federation must be affiliated to WSE.
- b) Following WSE INLINE HOCKEY EURO Competition rules - Article 11, WSE INLINE HOCKEY EURO matches are carried out as international matches. Players of a team participating in a WSE INLINE HOCKEY EURO must be in possession of the citizenship of the respective country. Proof of nationality (valid passport or national identity card) is required to take part to a WSE INLINE HOCKEY EURO. A player who cannot present either a valid passport or national identity card from the country concerned is not eligible to participate in any match of a WSE INLINE HOCKEY EURO.

8. ENTRY FEE

Following WSE INLINE HOCKEY EURO Competition rules - Article 5.5 to 5.8:

- a) For its team to be eligible to participate in the Competition, a Member Federation must pay to the WSE INLINE HOCKEY an entry fee per competition:
 - SENIOR WOMEN € 1000
 - JUNIOR WOMEN € 1000
 - U18 MEN € 800
 - U16 MEN € 700
- b) The fee payment must be received on the WSE INLINE HOCKEY account within the deadline set by the WSE INLINE HOCKEY and communicated in due course to all Member Federations.
- c) If the payment is not received by the WSE INLINE HOCKEY on the due date, the entry fee is automatically doubled.
- d) If the entry fee is not received within six (6) weeks after the announced deadline,

the Member Federation must be fined of an additional €2,000 and must be excluded from the respective Competition.

9. DOCUMENTS TO PROVIDE

- a) Following *WSE INLINE HOCKEY EURO Competition rules - Article 5.3*, for its team **to be eligible to participate** in the Competition, a Member Federation must fulfil the following criteria:
- ✦ It must **confirm in writing** that the Member Federation itself, its team players and officials and each and every delegation member **agree to respect the statutes, regulations, decisions** of the WSE and WSE INLINE HOCKEY and also **agree to recognize the jurisdiction of the WSE Court of Arbitration**.
 - ✦ It must confirm that **every player is in possession of a sports license** to practice Roller Inline Hockey in a high level of competition, in the country of the Member Federation
 - ✦ It must fill in the official **registration documents**, which must be received by the WSE INLINE HOCKEY within the deadline set by the latter and communicated in due course to all Member Federations.
- b) Following *WSE INLINE HOCKEY EURO Competition rules - Article 12*, national federation must provide **a list of 28 players and team officials** (“Official Squad List) while registering to the competition. This list will be reduced to 18 players, the day before the official start of the competition during the technical meeting.

12. REFEREES' INSTRUCTION AND BRIEFINGS

Following WSE INLINE HOCKEY EURO Competition rules - Article 14

Referee in Chief

14.8. Each year, federations have to communicate a list of all referees in activity with an international degree; they want to propose as refs for European Events. At the same time they can propose a list of deserving referees to be graduated

14.9. The referees of a WSE INLINE HOCKEY EURO are appointed by the referee in Chief, based on the list of referees in activity provided by federations to the referee commission. The referee, to be eligible, must be in possession of its international degree.

14.10. Each federation is in charge of the travel expenses of the referee(s), nominated by WSE INLINE HOCKEY

14.11. The appointed referees must acknowledge their nomination and inform the Referee in Chief and the Referee commission accordingly without delay. The nomination of the referees for a WSE INLINE HOCKEY EURO can be withdrawn at the WSE INLINE HOCKEY sole discretion.

14.12. The referees nomination is communicated by the Referee Commission to all parties concerned in due time prior to the beginning of a WSE INLINE HOCKEY EURO.

14.13. For each WSE INLINE HOCKEY EURO match, in due course before the match, the Referee in Chief can assign two (2) referees out of those nominated. The second two (2) referees are “reserve” referees. The WSE INLINE HOCKEY decision is final.

Arrival of referees for a WSE INLINE HOCKEY EURO

14.14. The WSE INLINE HOCKEY referees nominated for the WSE INLINE HOCKEY EURO must arrive at the relevant venue on the date and time communicated by the Referee in Chief, as planned and organised by WSE INLINE HOCKEY in cooperation with the Host Federation(s).

14.15. If any of the referees does not arrive at the match venue as planned and organised, the Referee Commission will take the appropriate decisions. Decision to replace the referees is always taken under WSE INLINE HOCKEY validation. Such a decision is final and no protest against the person or nationality of the referee is allowed.

Referees Refusal

14.16. If the appointed referees are unable to fulfil a nomination, they shall inform the Referee Commission without delay by phone and subsequently in writing. In this case, the Referee Commission and Referee in Chief appoint alternative referees.
